Kind-Hearted Plungers Jump for Athletes



One hundred and thirty six people raised money for Special Olympics Michigan by jumping into the lake for the Turk Lake/Greenville Polar Plunge.

One hundred and thirty six (136) area plungers helped make a difference for 21,000 athletes who take part in Special Olympics Michigan. These amazing participants asked friends, family, and businesses to donate money and in return that person or team would jump in Turk Lake on Saturday, February 11, 2017. The weather cooperated quite nicely with temperatures in the upper 30s to low 40s with hardly any wind.

At 2:50 in the afternoon, the plungers took to the ice for pictures and to get pumped up for their upcoming task of jumping into a hole that was cut into the freezing cold water. Many people came out to cheer on the individuals and teams. Some people may think they are crazy. Mike Hanrahan commented, "I am just a spectator. I have too much common sense to jump in." One could even buy a shirt that read, "too chicken to plunge!".

Some of the costumes that were worn included: Superman, the Ghostbusters, Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles, pajamas, suit and tie, bathing suits, team matching t-shirts, and so much more. The plungers cannon balled, flopped, and twisted, to raise (at the time of the writing) \$46,000.00. "It is amazing how much money they raise each year," said Kelly Dines, a spectator at the plunge. One of the dive team's divers even got out of the water to jump with the younger, individual participants. The participants received a towel after jumping in and quickly went to an area to change into dry clothes.

There were three judges that watched as plungers took to the ice. The three judges were WZZM-13's Juliet Dragos, Miss Danish Allison Harrison, and Miss Belding Lauren Thompson. It was their job to choose which plunger (team or individual) had the best costume. They definitely had a tough job because there were so many great costumes to choose from. However, in the end, they decided that best costume should be awarded to the first Ghostbusters Team (there were two teams that dressed in Ghostbuster costumes) that jumped into the lake. Harrison said that she was really happy that she was able to judge this year. Thompson added, "I definitely will be participating in next year's plunge."
