Remembering the 100th Anniversary of the End of WWI



Jim Wood playing Taps

A handful of hearty folks braved the cold temps last Sunday to remember America's soldiers who fought in the war that was to end all wars.

At 11 a.m. on November 11, 1918, the Armistice was signed ending World War I. For years at 11:00 on November 11, people gathered at Lakeview Cemetery to pay tribute to these brave soldiers.

The Hough/Pontius VFW 3701 hosted the ceremonies every year except last year. Even though the VFW no longer conducts a ceremony on Veterans Day, a few local residents still come out and continue the tradition.

This year Korean War Veteran Jim Wood, his wife Lee Wood, VFW 3701 Past Commander Jerry Walls, Dan Willison, and Molly and Jennifer Willison gathered in the cemetery.

Jim has recently taken up playing the trumpet and wanted to play taps. "I'm not very good," he said, "but I try."

Just as Jim raised the trumpet to his lips and started playing, the bell at

the United Church of Christ chimed. It was exactly 11:00 a.m.

Each person spoke about the importance of veterans and how remembering them is something every American should

"If only one person remembers," Lee Wood said, "then they are remembered."

They first gathered at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, then later visited the headstone of Pvt. Ernest D. Worley of Lakeview. The name on the stone is Wortley, but according to the Internet, it should be Worley.

Worley isn't actually buried in Lakeview Cemetery. There is just a headstone there to remember him. He is buried in France where he died on July 19, 1918 at 20 years old. He was a member of Company E, 26th Infantry Regiment, 1st Infantry Di-

Dan Willison observed, "If he had lived just four months longer, he would have come home."

Thank you for continuing this tradition of remembering our veterans on Veterans Day.

Coming to a Farm Near You

NextEra Energy, a subsidiary of Florida Power and Light, is the third company to take a serious look at Montcalm County for placement of wind farms, where wind energy is converted to electricity.

A called meeting Thursday evening (November 8th) at the 4-H Fairgrounds in Greenville, featured a staff of NextEra


experts making a presentation to land owners, township officials, county Board of Commission members and staff.

Presenter, Erico Lopez, said NextEra is the nation's top generator of electricity from wind, and boasted of three wind farms already operating in Michigan

"We're studying wind resources here now," he told the group of 50. "We anticipate construction in Montcalm County to be happening in the spring of 2021 and production by winter that year."

Land excavation has already begun on a 40-acre solar-energy farm near Howard City, signaling a beginning of the green-energy emphasis in the state. Another 200-acre site is slated to be coming in as well. That location has not been disclosed.
