Infant and Aunt Killed in M-46

Aero-Med in flight to hospital with victim of car crash

Nine-month-old Annalee Baker was killed early Sunday afternoon in a violent truck-auto collision on M-46 at Amble Road. Annie's aunt, 18year-old Samantha, died approximately 24-hours later, Monday afternoon, around 2:00, apparently from brain injuries.

The crash, which is still under investigation by Michigan State Police, happened when the smallred Ford Focus, driven by Michelle Baker, 46, traveling eastbound, stopped at the intersection, waiting for traffic to clear for a left-hand turn to travel north on Amble Road. A

Dodge pickup was reported by the State Police to be driven by 27-year-old Brian Johnson of Cedar Springs, rear-ended the Ford, knocking it into oncoming traffic and into the path of another pickup that stuck the car, pushing both Ford and Dodge into the ditch on the southwest corner of the intersection.

Annalee's aunt. Samantha, 18, apparently in the front-passenger's seat, was taken by Aero-Med to Spectrum and hospitalized in critical condition with brain injuries, for which she had surgery. Monday, the family struggled with the decision to remove life Samantha's support.

in the back seat with the baby, was transported to Kelsey Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. Samantha was an employee of B.C.'s Pizza. Julie, Annie's mother, was working at Save-A-Lot when the crash occurred.

Michelle Baker, age 46. mother of Samantha and Julie, was also hospitalized. Five of the six people in the crash were transported for medical care.

The driver of the other westbound pickup, 54-year-old Annette Dow of Sand Lake, was also taken to Kelsey Hospital with minor injuries.
