#### Haymarsh Hunt Club

The Haymarsh Hunt Club at 11959 Jefferson Road in Morley is a pheasant and upland game bird preserve situated on 760 acres with 13 fields plus one larger one for corporate outings. It is owned by Rob Wynalda of Rockford but is managed by a local couple, Ben and Ashley Covey with help from former manager Tim Somerville. The club was founded by Bud Gummer in 1989 and Tim worked with Bud until he passed away in 2007.

"Tim's resources and knowledge are invaluable," Ashley said.

Ben and Ashley Covey have two children, Taylor and Colton, ages 2 and 5. They used to live in Lakeview, but now live in a house on the Haymarsh property where Tim and his wife Paula used to

How did they get into managing a hunt club? This is an interesting story. When Ben was in I high school, he had to participate in a job shadowing project and asked Tim if he could job shadow him at the club.

Years later when he heard that the club was being sold, he called Tim and asked, "Do you remember me?" He said that he did, and the rest is history.

The club is licensed through the State of Michigan to have a longer hunting season for game birds, August 15 to April 30. "Members and nonmembers can hunt nine months out of the year,"

Tim said.

The club also offers Short Gun Sport (five stand) which is a clayshooting event. He or she moves among five sport stands and shoot five clays at each stand.

"We are planning to enclose the stands and heat them," Tim said. "That is unusual."

Some people come to Haymarsh to work their bird dogs. "If you want to work with a dog, but don't have one, we can get a bird dog guide for you to hunt with," Ashley said.

Another thing the club provides is "European Hunts" similar to those in England. It is a driven hunt and mostly for corporate outings.

There are different ways you can join the Haymarsh Hunt Club. There are General Memberships, Family Memberships or Corporate Memberships. For first timers who want to try it out, there is a Demo package. If wanting to join after trying it out with a Demo, the other membership packages are 20%

"We also rent the club house out for events," Ashley said. "We may have a wedding there soon."

Although the percentage of male members is higher than female, there is interest among the ladies too. Recently, they had a Women's Hunt where 30 women showed up and they had nine all-women teams. In January, they will have a co-ed hunt and on December 21, there is an all-men hunt.

## Montcalm Officials Threatened

Tuesday, at 7:42 a.m., a person indicating his name is Shawn Evans, sent an email to every elected and appointed official in the county, townships and communities, specifically naming Judge Kreeger, Prosecutors Andrea Krause and Christopher Heckman, as being in violation of law. Evans, if that is his name, made reference to a YouTube video he apparently made, which is the content of the email, using a British-sounding voice, the National Anthem, and photos of the three named. The threat of suit appears to be marijuana/cannabis related,

and could relate to a case where Judge Kreeger denied a female defendant's request to use marijuana in jail for pain she claimed to have. Judge Kreeger told her that other pain medication was available. Obviously, marijuana is not the only substance used for pain management, and allowing marijuana / cannabis in the jail would

cannabis in the jail would be a most unusual situation.

The YouTube address is listed at the end of this article. Here is the full text of the email:

As we head into the 2020 election cycle, I just want to remind our elected officials of Montcalm County, Michigan, that you signed a sworn oath of office to uphold the Constitutions of Michigan and the United States as well as all of the laws.

When notified of criminal allegations, you have the legal obligation to demand an investigation or to report those criminal allegations to the appropriate authorities. Failure to do so makes one an "accessory after the fact", is obstruction of justice, and is a willful violation of your sworn oath of office and an abuse of your power and authority of office, which may lead to fines and jail time.
