Welcome to the Issachar Perspective – hosted by Pastor Simon Endacott and the Sylvester Community Church Elders.

About twenty-five people came out last Saturday morning to hear an introduction on just what this Issachar Perspective is all about -- and why it just might be relevant to us today. Maybe now more than ever. I Chronicles 12:32 describes the tribe of Issachar as men who "had

to know what Israel ought to do..." And don't we need that today? "An understanding of the times... " Boy, do we ever. To live lovingly in unity with all people. There seems to be much division in our beloved America today. How do we heal that? changing Things are quickly-things that affect our daily lives. And not all of the changes are good. Some would say that is an understatement. The Issachar Perspective sessions aim to address some issues and areas where, as Christians, we need to stand boldly for Christ in a quickly evolving culture. Lakeview residents Garth and Vickie Bunker were there. As they visited with others at their table, Garth said, "We're really here to learn more about things that are happening in our

world today and get a Biblical perspective."

The first one-hour session, (featuring free coffee and donuts), included a time of teaching and interaction and then allowed for questions and answers. Pastor Endacott began with the purpose of the sessions. Why are we here? He cited Matthew 24:5 "...do not be deceived." He spoke of how it is easy to be deceived in our world today. In order to speak the truth in love, we must first know what the truth is. During these Issachar sessions we will look to the scriptures to see what God says about any given topic. He then gave a historical overview of who Issachar was and his place in the Old Testa-
