The Varsity Wrestling team had an exciting week starting off with securing a league title last Wednesday, January 30th. It was the first time in 8 years that Lakeview Wrestling has been able to claim this honor. The Cats went 8-0 this season securing it with their victories at home over Reed City (48-33) and Big Rapids (62-9). The team also honored their seniors Joseph Perez 113#, Bryce Jacobs 120#,

Espn Brigham #132, Trent Cole #144, Jesse Brandt #150, Aaron Mazurek #157, Clayton Martin #157, Tiernyn Muste #175, and Gordon Kenney #285. Senior Joseph Perez states, "I'm excited about taking the league this year and am looking forward to post season. Hopefully everyone stays healthy and uninjured. Next week's District match up should be a good one. We would like to go for a 3rd straight title but know it will not be easy." On Saturday, January 28th, the team traveled to Shelby to compete in a 12-team dual. The Wildcats competed well going 4-1 on the day giving Coach Todd Barton his 150th career win! They came out victors against Grant (70-8), Mason County Central (69-11), Cedar Springs (41-27), and Fremont (42-30). They fell to Hart (24-46) placing 2nd overall. This brings the Cats to a record of 19-3 for the season. Going 4-0 for the day was Sadie Cavendish 106#, going 5-

They had a lot of reasons as to why they could have performed poorly but didn't let those excuses get to them. The team pushed all of the distractions to the back of their minds and stayed focused on winning. A 4-1 finish at the Shelby tournament is a great showing among good competition. I'm proud of
