the evening's program along with free water to help us keep cool. They had set up a table to offer baked goods and lemonade, in addition to selling tickets for a 50/50 drawing. All the proceeds will go toward their plans to adopt a Lakeview area family for Thanksgiving and another for Christmas.

Being on the threshold of the Fourth of July, Dean Gilbert had invited members of the local VFW post to present the colors while Brianna Herzog sang the national anthem. Brianna remained up front and I invited other members of Free Flight, both band and sound team, to come forward, along with Dallas Lincoln. Free Flight is usually performing during our season, but unfortunately, the band has needed to end their playing days.
